PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is pleasing to wrap another season for the QRRA after our successes of 2024. Being in the role of President for 2024 is made easier, and rewarding, simply by the passion and commitment our members show as volunteers to the game. We continue to grow and demonstrate our "Club" attitude through supporting each other and celebrating the wins along the way but also picking up our team mates when needed.

Firstly, I would like to thank our Management Committee - as a group we have all worked tirelessly for no other reason than to do everything we can to allow our members to participate, enjoy, develop and progress to the best of their abilities with the opportunities that present. At the end of 2024 Paul Henwood has decided to step off the MC and I would like to thank Paul for his contributions and work over the past 2 seasons. Our Appointments Officers - Neill and Scott, thank you for your time and work in a role that is constantly requiring change and attention to detail. A huge thanks to our Sponsors - Chemist Warehouse, TFH & Canterbury. Season 2024 is the first of our 3-year sponsorship cycle and we are grateful that with our Sponsors support we can continue to provide quality on field kit, operational services and development opportunities to our members.

To our partners in the game - Governing Bodies, Competitions Managers, School Associations and Clubs - the QRRA is strongly committed to servicing the game to the best standards we can while ensuring our members are protected and respected. We will continue to welcome all involved in the Game to work with us to improve and grow the Match Official community but also the environments and attitudes our games are played in and with, which at times during 2024 have been the worst we have experienced.

This leads me to Match Official Abuse and the abhorrent attitudes and behaviors our members have been faced with in 2024. It is a shame that going back on our Annual Reports myself and Presidents before me for at least 6 years have needed to address this matter. Since becoming President I have been vocal with the QRU and Club Presidents that change was needed or a Match Officials was going to be hurt - in 2024 one our members were physically assaulted and my worst fears were realized. Unfortunately, during the year there were far too many incidents again at all levels of the game where our members were abused, insulted or disrespected which culminated during the final's series of some of the most disgusting behaviors targeting our members - disappointingly at times perpetrated by professionally contracted players. While Rugby is not the only sport impacted by this and it is certainly a wider societal issue, it is our sport that we love and can play a part in making it better. With the very public culmination of issues this year the QRU and Clubs have fully acknowledged that change is needed and to put it simply - the rot has to stop. Watch this space as we lead to Season 2025 with cleaning up behaviors and building respect takes a prominent position on the agenda.

As you will see in the pages following, we have had some fantastic milestones during 2024 with many members reaching 100, 500 and even 600 games during the season. We also have several members reaching 10, 15, 20 and 25 years' service to the game which is further sign of the commitment and passion of our members. Congratulations to all members who achieved these milestones with a shout out to Rob Harvey on his 600 career games leading the way for the year!

We were fortunate to continue our Interchanges this season seeing Match Officials travel to Wellington, Christchurch, NSW for Shute Shield and Senior matches as well as Hong Kong and Singapore. The continuance of these opportunities for our members are a testament to the relationships we have grown and the impressions our members leave when visiting other Associations and Competitions. During the year we also continued our "Saturday Clubhouse" functions at various times (mostly coinciding with interchange referees being in town). These events will continue in 2025 and I encourage our members to engage in the opportunity to mix and enjoy healthy banter about our games and experiences in this environment. On that topic, I would like to thank Jeremy Markey for again organising a fantastic Season Dinner and Awards Night at Blackbird in September. Its great to see the night growing and providing a platform for us to get to know each other better off the field and build the comradery that contributes to success and enjoyment.

Throughout the year it is pleasing to see the QRRA again having our members recognised with appointments on the International Stage - Nic Berry, Brett Cronan, Jess Ling, Damon Murphy, George Meyers & Reuben Keane have all continued to be rewarded for their performances by World Rugby on the XV's and 7's stages. We also saw Jeremy Markey and James Palmer continuing to receive RA Appointments as Assistant Referees to Super Rugby. As RA continue to develop pathway opportunities at u19, u18 and u15 this also flows to more of our developing and community Match Officials being presented opportunities and this group has been well supported by Paul McKay and Ben Dorrington-Plumb. Kirk Astill, Rory Crombie, Ziggy Day, Hamish Hunt, Zander Knoetze, Charlie Marshall, Rob Southwood and Angus Young have all benefited as Referee's or Assistant Referees in these local rep competitions.

The development of our Match Officials is one that takes a lot of dedication and time - in 2024 Cameron Stanfield very successfully took the lead of our Premier Squad and the overwhelming feedback from Clubs in the showpiece of our local game was that it is clear the QRRA is doing the right things and getting some positive results while striving for improvement. As mentioned, Paul McKay and Ben Dorrington-Plumb have both put in huge efforts with our Community and Developing Match Officials locally which has seen several referees take leaps forward in their performances and levels of appointment. As is a constant, we have our stalwart Ref Coaches continuing to add value around the game - I don't think too many weekends past where I didn't bump into Paul Evans somewhere watching referees (both Junior and Senior!). During the season it has also been fantastic to see a level of communication and co-operation with Rugby Australia - specifically Brendan McKibbin and Graham Cooper - around supporting and developing our Members, something we have longed for and struggled without in seasons past.

I would like to wish all of our Match Official Community and their families a safe and festive Christmas - enjoy the down time and recharge for 2025.

APPOINTMENTS OFFICER'S REPORTS

Senior and School Appointments

The importance of the Appointments function of the Association cannot be understated. To our members this is a representation of the 'bread and butter' of why they referee and to the rest of the rugby community it is how the Association is seen and evaluated. Bottom line is that it is not just our members who look to see who has been appointed to their games.

Fair to say that challenges that we faced this year were not significantly different from prior seasons, in particular:

- The season is becoming longer and longer with kick off for trial games for community rugby from early
 February and 7s tournaments and speciality carnivals fully entrenched until late November. This means
 refereeing fatigue resulting in many referees and referee coaches at all levels not making themselves
 available.
- There is a double-edged sword with increasing numbers of representative fixtures particularly in what was the traditional off season. It is pleasing that our members are receiving appointments (including support roles) at these levels, however, this taxes our resources for our own games.
- We remain fully taxed during the peak part of the season. Realistically there is a shortage of approximately 30 more experienced referees to meet all of our requirements. This means that our primary way of addressing this is by our members stepping up by taking on further appointments.
- We are also increasingly being requested to appoint further afield particularly to more games in the Gold Coast and Ipswich areas. The payment of a fuel subsidy over above match payments has made these more palatable for members. We now also have regular formal competitions on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday nights.
- Interchange international and interstate programs are now again fully operational with these enhanced by internal interchanges providing opportunities for our referees to referee A grade games in our local neighbour competitions in Toowoomba, Sunshine Coast and Gold Coast. This also provided development opportunities for referees from the Country Associations in our competitions.
- The Rugby Explorer system we utilise to administer the Appointments systems has shortcomings
 including no interfaces meaning manual input requirements. The system also lacks a notification
 function when changes are made by Competition Managers (eg changes in venues or times). Whilst
 there have been enhancements, further work is required to streamline functions to make them more
 user friendly.

A couple of major developments have been very positive.

- The formation of the Queensland Country Rugby Referees Association has provided a joint platform to manage and lead the various Championships and representative fixtures throughout the State. I particularly wish to acknowledge the invaluable contribution of my fellow Appointments Officer, Ian McGowan to make this workable at an operational level from both Associations' perspectives.
- The implementation of the Pathways program under Ben Dorrington Plumb encompassing formation of the Transition Squad under Paul McKay has provided the capabilities to move referees into Grade and Colts football in a far more functional manner.

Lastly a few thank yous:

- Thanks to Cameron Stanfield, Paul Marks and Simon Moore (as well as fellow Appointments Officer, Scott Chapman and Administration Officer, Nick Joseph) for your on-going support.
- Thank you to all the referee coaches for the feedback provided to referees and particularly to myself to assist in the appointments processes.
- Thank you to our stakeholders and competition managers (particularly Connor Ellis at QRU) for your assistance.
- Lastly and most importantly, Thanks to our members particularly those who have been flexible providing assistance to meet our workloads.

Onwards and upwards towards season 2025.
