#### ANNUAL REPORT 1967 SEASON

Gentlemen,

Your committee thanks all members and officials for their contribution to another very crowded season. The Management Committee and the Appointments Board are aware of the need to attract more members to boost the active strength of the Association. As will be seen later in the report 48 referees officiated during the season, this must be near a record. However the number of full time active referees is not enough to meet the demands on the Association without resorting to doubling up at weekends. The Association as whole must work together to bring the numbers up.

Once again more than forty visits were made to centres outside the metropolitan area. Your committee wishes to thank the Greater Public Schools Sports Association and the rector of Downslands College for their help in meeting the cost of these trips.

The exchange of referees between N.S.W. and Queensland for the interstate series continued despite some early vetoes by the N.S.W.R.U. Mr. Lindsay Smith controlled the first interstate match in Brisbane and Bob Burnett refereed the final match of the series in Sydney.

Another N.S.W. visitor was Dr. Perrott, of the N.S.W. Appointments Board, who accepted an invitation to deliver the W.D.Wyllie Memorial Lecture. Dr. Perrott also visited Toowoomba as a guest of the Darling Downs Referees' Association. These visits proved very successful and should continue to add extra interest to refereeing for the members.

In August Ansett-ANA generously offered a return flight to New Guinea for Lecture purposes and Bob Burnett was selected for this visit. It seems that these lecture tours will increase in occurance as Rugby spreads throughout the State and in neighbouring northern countries. The Association welcomes this opportunity to serve Rugby in yet another way. The Association in particular, and Rugby generally, lost heavily through John Forbes transfer to Newcastle late in the Season. John's final match was Queensland v. Victoria and his last administrative contribution was the drafting of the Association's new Constitution, which was adopted in July. We wish to thank John for all his work and to wish him all the best in the future both in refereeing and in his new career.

Our Annual Dinner was again held at the Rugby Club, and a good time was had by all those who attended. The John Minter Award, for the member who contributed most to Rugby Refereeing in Queensland, during the current Season, was given by the Life Members to Mr. Howard Clark, an untiring worker for the Association and Rugby.

As soon as the Season's burdens were put aside, your Committee became most active in planning for a bigger and more vital association to meet the challenge of 1968. The achievements of the Q.R.U. must not be minimised by a lack of referees or the want of true Rugby spirit in its members.

We invite all present members to continue refereeing in 1968 and share in what promises to be most exciting year of football.

It is pleasing to be able to report that 19 candidates were orally examined for Senior membership during the season and this must surely reflect the growing interest in our game. Of this number however only 5 are regularly available to your Association here in Brisbane; 10 were staff members from Marist Brothers College Ashgrove and are fully occupied with Associated Schools' games on Saturdays but will be in a position to assist us on Sundays, while 1 candidate was from the Darling Downs district and 2 from Wide Bay. In almost all cases preexamination tutorial assistance was given and your Board feels that it is only in this way that the high standards of law-knowledge which the Association expects from its members can be maintained.

Lectures in the various schools and at some Club training nights were again in popular demand and the Board would like to express its thanks to all Association members who assisted in this very important part of our function. More than 100 follow-up written examinations were conducted and as a result we now have additional Junior and Associate members in both Toowoomba and Brisbane which should steadily add to the stature of our game.

My personal thanks to the members of the Examination Board, all of whom gave so unstintingly of their time and effort in the interests of Rugby.
