ON SOME OCCASIONS, MEMBERS WERE REQUIRED TO DOUBLE UP FOR GAMES AND PARTICULARLY DURING THE SCHOOL SEASON WE WERE STRETCHED TO THE LIMITS. THERE WERE REASONS FOR THE SHORTAGE - INJURIES, BUSINESS TRIPS, CHANGE OF SCHOOL HOLIDAYS AND SO ON.

WE AGAIN MET THE A GRADE COACHES ON A FORMAL BASIS.FROM THIS MEETING SOME GOOD POINTS WERE BROUGHT OUT FROM BOTH PARTIES. HOWEVER, I WOULD LIKE TO SEE A GREATER USE MADE BY THE CLUBS OF OUR REFEREES. AND OUR MEETING NIGHTS.

OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH THE PRESS HAS NOT BEEN THE BEST THIS YEAR.

THE CRITICISM BY COACHES TO THE PRESS ABOUT REFEREEING DECISIONS WAS SO BAD THAT I BELIEVE THE COACHES THEMSELVES DO NOT KNOW THE LAW OR ITS APPLICATION. WE HAVE ALWAYS MADE OURSELVES AVAILABLE FOR DISCUSSION AFTER MATCHES OR BY INVITATION TO VISIT THE RESPECTIVE CLUB. THESE ALTERNATIVES WERE TURNED DOWN IN FAVOUR OF PUBLICITY IN THE PRESS. THE COMMENTS REGARDING THE INTEGRITY OF SOME OF OUR REFEREES WAS NOT APPRECIATED.

WE DO NOT WISH TO REACT AGAINST CRITICISM BY THE PRESS THROUGH THE PRESS. FOUL PLAY IS STILL OF MAJOR CONCERN. THIS INCLUDES COLLAPSING OF WHILST WE CONSIDER SERIOUS INSTANCES NOT AS HIGH AS IN PREVIOUS YEARS, REFEREES STILL SEEM TO BE BLAMED MORE THAN THE PLAYERS MAY I REMIND YOU THAT IT IS NOT THE REFEREES WHO COMMIT FOUL PLAY, AND THAT MOST INCIDENTS ARE NOT PREMEDITATED. OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH THE QUEENSLAND RUGBY UNION WAS THE BEST WE HAVE HAD IN YEARS AND WE THANK MR. NORBERT BYRNE, MR. TERRY DOYLE AND MR. DAVE ROBERTS FOR THEIR ASSISTANCE DURING THE YEAR. THE DAY TO DAY OPERATIONS WERE EFFECTIVELY CONDUCTED BY SECRETARY GRAHAM LAWSON, TREASURER ASHLEY BROAD, AND PHIL JONES FOR HIS WORK IN ORGANISING THE APPOINTMENTS, TOGETHER WITH THE REST OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE. I TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO THANK THEM ALL FOR THEIR EFFORTS. I WOULD LIKE TO THANK MY EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AND THE VARIOUS SUB-COMMITTEES FOR THE EXCELLENT WORK WHICH THEY HAVE DONE THIS YEAR. ### APPOINTMENTS BOARD REPORT - 1985

A glance at the statistics will show that over 1,000 games were referred by our members this season. Most of the appointments were made by this Board or by the Queensland Rugby Union Representative Appointments Board on which John Forbes, Alan Taylor and I also sat.

One feature was the increase in the number of appointments given to visiting referees. While it demonstrated the marked difference in the general standard of performance between the Country referees and the Brisbane referees it clearly showed that, given the opportunity, one or two Country referees could do quite well if they were refereeing in the Brisbane Competition regularly. Of the inter-state and overseas visitors, Jean-Claude Ysche demonstrated a style all his own.

Another feature was the number of opportunities given to certain of our members to referee at a higher level than they had hitherto. These were not experimental appointments - as we were accused of making - they were made in the full knowledge of each referee's capabilities and current form. We did not take risks - our own integrety was at stake, too - we had done our 'homework' and their good performances did not surprise us.

Attempts were made to get the weekly appointments sheets out to members much earlier this season but, regrettably, the draw was not always available in time. Where we were successful, the number of late 'cry-offs' was considerably reduced and also made for easier co-operation with the Junior Association which was so important. There were also problems with late changes with the draw usually concerning the Colts - after it had been promulgated. Many of these changes seemed to us to be unecessary, considering the lateness of the hour, and showed little regard for the referees' position.

We were surprised to learn of complaints from the winners of the G.P.S. Competition regarding the standard of appointment to their games and the quality of performance - considering all their games were refereed by six of the top seven referees. Happily, other schools and clubs showed their appreciation for the services rendered by members.

I would again point to the need for a closer liaison

between representatives of the Australian R.U.Appointments Board, the Queensland R.U.Representative Appointments Board and this Board. We are all concerned with the development of the same referees, albeit at different levels, and it seems to be essential that we work together in order to ensure that, not only are the best appointments made, but also that those appointed are at the top of their form at the vital moment.

My thanks to John Forbes for his co-operation and wise counselling, to Ces Menzies for his guidance and co-operation, to Alan Taylor for his support as Chairman of the Classification Committee and to the members and Committee of the Junior Association without whose co-operation we could not have managed. Thanks, too, to members of our own Management Committee but, most of all, to all members of the Association for co-operation, not least in turning out at very short notice especially in mid-week. The efforts of members to keep me informed of availability were much appreciated also. I regret the occasions when my memory was seriously at fault.

Finally, congratulations to Kerry Fitzgerald who, in the past twelve months will have been appointed to no less than seven major Internationals.

The Lectures Committee sincerely thanks all the Referees and Lecturers for providing a full and continuous season of informative and thought provoking points of law at the bi-weekly meetings.

#### USHERING REPORT

The 1985 season was not very successful in Referees participating in the Ushering duties of this Association. Twelve Test and Representative Games involved ushering this season at Ballymore. Special thanks are due to Dennis Woodman, Shaun Cuffe and Chris Rutherford who ushered on every occassion and to those other Referees and juniors (Kim Buchanan and the BBC boys) who gave up their valuable time to undertake ushering duties during the season.

A report dated 16/8/85 was given to the Executive Committee highlighting the ushering duties and performances over the season. This report recommends that the Association discontinues its ushering arrangement at Ballymore after this season's commitments. This has resulted from the lack of participation and reluctance by Referees generally to undertake the duties required. The report advocates that all Referees be granted an Admission Ticket to Ballymore and all Club grounds for all games - Test and Representative included.

The Executive Committee has accepted the report's recommendation and has advised the QRU of this decision. It is not known what progress has been made with the Admission Ticket?

#### EXAMINATION BOARD REPORT

Without the preparation by Peter Galloway last year, I would not have achieved so much this year - many thanks Peter.

A new Examination Paper was drawn up this year, incorporating all the 1985 law changes and sections of the U19 Laws. The efforts of Ted Apted, Colin Waldron, Kerry Fitzgerald and Dick Byers in proofing and contributing is gratefully appreciated.

A Touch Judge Badge course was established this season and received approval and acceptance by the QRU Grades Committee. The purpose is to qualify Club, Sub-district and School Touch Judges and hopefully enlist Referees as a result. There has been no further response to the course after the completion by 30 boys from both Nudgee Junior College and Ipswich Grammar School. I hope this course will be encouraged by the Executive Committee early in the 1986 season, particularly at the club level.

Kerry Fitzgerald and Kim Buchanan conducted a Refereeing Course and exams at Brisbane Boys College this year over an intense seven week period. Twelve students qualified and hopefully will join the Association in the near future. Well done Kerry and Kim, the Association is most appreciative. Schools are the primary recruiting grounds for Referees and this function, in my opinion, is the most important the Association can perform.

Congratulations to the Referees who qualified by examination after attending our lectures and were field tested this season - welcome to the Association.

#### AUSTRALIAN LAWS COMMITTEE

The Committee met twice this year and discussed general law interpretation and questions which have been circulated to associations.

The committee received the 1985 Experimental Law Variations and recommended one change. This being the removal of the obligation of a referee to halt a maul if a participating player kneels and looses his footing.

The Under 19 laws are being reviewed by the ARU and this is not a function of the laws committee.

### JUDICIARY MEMBERS REPORT

During the 1985 season, the Judiciary committee was afforded the luxury of one night's leave from duty, from the first fixture of the season right through until the Monday night after the Grand Final. This year saw an increase in 1st Grade offenders and a welcome decrease in the appearance of the Colt division players.

Reports generally were an improvement on previous lodgements in that referees became more specific. However on occasions the committee members were unable to decipher the message from the tangled web of illegible handcraft presented.

As a member of the Judiciary committee I was greatly disturbed by the number of successful appeals against suspensions. The majority of appeals received a reduced sentence or a favourable variation for the appellant. It can induce one to wonder if the cause is justified when the committee has met on occasions for over  $2\frac{1}{7}$  hours on the Monday night.

I wish to thank Mr John Forbes for his appearance on those occasions when business interests precluded my attendance

#### GRADES COMMITTEE

The major function of the Referee's representative of this Committee is to facilitate the smooth functioning and administration of the league competition of all grades, inclusive of Colts.

This manifests itself mainly in two forms; firstly, suggestions from referees as to how the clubs might improve their facilities, match management, organization and referee's hospitality; and secondly, suggestions from the clubs as to how feferees might improve their game management, consistency and relations with clubs and their officials.

The major items for discussions this season included; kick-off times and the notification of appropriate officials, pitch conditions and line markings, hospitality shown to referees, interpretation of law and the functions of the Judiciary and Appeals Committees. Although the interface between the two parties undoubtedly facilitated a greater understanding of common problems there were areas of conflict. These consisted of complaints by referees about the lack of support shown to referees by the Appeals Committee when dramatically overturning the Judiciary's sentences and of complaints by the clubs about specific referees and their inadequacies. These debates were at times acrimonious.

The Referee's Association organized a touch judging course in an attempt to alleviate the dearth of referees, the clubs were apathetic in their support of this scheme despite early enthusiasm.

In conclusion it should be stated that the continued presence of the Referee's representative on the Grades Committee is desirable in that it does provide a forum for debating certain key issues.
