



Although we approached the task with varying degrees of experience, enthusiasm and availability, the degree of co-operation was excellent. I and, I am sure, all members are grateful to my colleagues. We are also grateful to those senior referees who helped from time to time and to those in the Country Districts, inter-state and overseas who also supplied us with reports.

All active members of the Association were seen on more than one occasion, some many times, although for one reason or another reports were not issued on every occasion. These overall figures indicate members of this committee put in a lot of work during the season. However, we are aware that quantity is not everything and we are conscious of the need to be continually striving to improve the quality.

As a result it was possible to review performances and to classify referees throughout the season and to offer guidance to the Appointments Board. However, since the Appointments Officer was not a member of the Classification Committee the influence of the Classification Committee on

appointments was minimal. This committee feels appointments should be a part of the function of the Classification Committee and should be made by a member or members of this committee.

We feel the standard of refereeing, overall, is quite high technically which, unfortunately, makes for some congestion at the upper levels and, consequently, progress for those lower down the list must be slow. With such a limited programme to service it is impracticable to have too many referees operating at the higher levels.

Certain common areas of deficiency in refereeing were noted during the season and these will be passed to the appropriate committees as suggested topics for coaching sessions, lectures etc. next season.

In addition to our work in and around Brisbane, visits were made to Gympie, Emerald, Mt. Isa, Stanthorpe, Maroochydore, Maryborough and Bundaberg to look at Queensland Country referees. We are grateful to Ron Bourke, Director of the North Division, for his several reports on referees in that area. We feel we know a little more about Country referees than previously.

Finally, members of this committee are appreciative of the willingness of most members to discuss their performances and listen to comments after a game. We are very much aware of our own limitations and fallibility. Our only aim was to be helpful and we hope we were accepted in that way.

QUEENSLAND RUGBY REFEREES ASSOCIATION

Points noted by members of the Classification Committee during Season 1986 considered worthy of further discussion.

1. Player with the ball - usually half-back or forward peeling off - forcing his way into his own pack of forwards in front of him.
2. Player with the ball running into a member of his own team in front of him who then holds on to him to shield the ball in an off-side and obstructing position.
3. Put-in at the scrum
 - a) Half-back not square with mid-tunnel.
 - b) Half-back too close.
 - c) Half-back delaying put-in.
4. Fringe players unbinding while ball is still in scrum, ruck or maul and not retiring.
5. "Taking out" of backs in open play - especially at lower levels.
6. Players not attempting to retire (loitering with intent) from 10m. circle at kicks - especially short kicks.
7. Players (usually centre) off-side as kicker (inside centre or five-eight) steadies to kick.
8. Delaying throw-in at line-out.
9. Backs off-side at line-out when two-handed catch results in a maul.
10. Referees getting too close to play - and remaining there.

JUDICIARY REPORT

The 1986 season recorded 51 appearances before the Judiciary. It is pleasing to report in some instances an improvement in the recording of facts relating to the incident. This factor must continue as the Judiciary committee is in the majority of instances faced with a totally different record of facts by the offending player than what is written.

Of further interest is, once again, the number of successful appeals which reduce the sentence awarded. This action does tend to make one wonder about the system when other critics accuse the committee of not being severe enough with penalties. I offer my thanks to J. Forbes and P. Betchel for assisting on the nights I was unavailable.

AUSTRALIAN SOCIETY OF RUGBY REFEREES

The last year has been an excellent one for Australian Refereeing. Four Australian referees have been appointed to internationals in Brian Kinsey, Kerry Fitzgerald, Bob Fordham and Colin Waldron and all received excellent reports. Our President, Dick Byres, was invited to the United States for a referee's coaching tour.

The standing of Australian refereeing is now the equal (or better) of any in World Rugby and it is the Society's aim to maintain that position.

Next year we plan to hold an Advanced Referees Seminar which will aim to maintain our high standards and prepare referees of the future.

We will also be organising a Referees Coaching Course and an extensive manual, which will be conducted in conjunction with the Rothmans National Coaching Course.

The World Cup will involve the Society in a great deal of organisation for visiting teams and referees, and plans are in hand for this.

Other matters being handled are:

1. The finalisation of the Referee Assessment Guidelines for which the Society would like to thank Phil Jones for all his preparation and effort;
2. The production of a referees recruitment video;
3. Updating and standardising our "on field attire".

The newsletter was again produced this year and the editor would appreciate any contributions in the form of articles or your comments on any Rugby matters.
