President's Report

Last year I spoke of the need for change and the real challenges of adapting if refereeing in Queensland was to develop and prosper. It was with some reservation that the QRRRA embarked on reevaluating its operations, its beliefs and how referees would interact with and be received by the rest of the rugby community. I am happy to report that the direction we embarked upon has proved successful and we have commenced evolving from a purely amateur body into a vibrant, independent and semi-professional organisation. I am also pleased to announce that QRRRA (Brisbane) Inc. is in a sound financial position and well positioned to continue support for appointments, coaching, training and ongoing referee education and accreditation.

No organisation such as ours can survive without sponsors. We are indebted to Ian Elcock and Tony Jones from Precision Eyewear for their continued support throughout the year as our major sponsor. Of no less importance was the support given by Dixon Homes to our referee coaches who now are easily recognised by their distinctive clothing. Coopers Plains Dental also provided support by the supply of red and yellow cards in a distinctive wallet. Paddington Physiotherapy has again supported referees with professional advice and hands on help when required. The Association thanks all our sponsors for their continuing support.

The strength of our Association is in part reflected in the achievements of our referees and coaches at the State, National and International level. Andrew Cole and Scott Young were again active in the Test and Super 12 arena and Greg Hinton was appointed to his first test. Pat Rae, Greg Cuthbert, Steve Lesczynski, Terry O'Connor, Cole Barrett and Frank Meiklejohn were selected for various National Championships either as referees or coaches. In addition Terry O'Connor, Laurie Monaghan and Frank Meiklejohn have been invited to participate in the LIII Referee Coaching Programme for 2002 and Michael Jennings will be participating in the LIII Referee Programme. Their success is a measure of the value and expertise of our coaches and assessors and the development programmes they administer. They are an integral part of referee development on the local, national and international scenes and their efforts are to be applauded. Another facet of our strength lies in our coaches group ably led by Terry O'Connor. The Association would be much poorer without their considerable efforts and dedication and we should all take a moment to thank them for their hard work.

This year the Association could not have functioned as well as it did if it were not for the overwhelming support of our members. The patience and dedication shown by you all allowed the Appointments Board to fill in excess of 3000 games this season and amply demonstrates where our major strength lies. Special recognition is given to Peter Smith for chairing the Appointments Board and to the long hours and hard work put in by the members of the board. Special thanks are extended to Geoff Pegg and Tom Ryan who battled away with the major portion of the appointments and worked long and hard to ensure games had a referee appointed. Without their dedication and diligent work this vital phase of our association would not have functioned as well as it did. Gentlemen congratulations on a job well done.

The Queensland Rugby Union has been very supportive of our Association throughout the year and I sincerely thank Steve Thornton, Geoff Shaw, Roger Plastow, Rod Cousins and Gavin Head. They all gave unstintingly of their time and provided support and expert advice when required. A special thank you is extended to the QRU Referee Accreditation and Development Manager Cole Barrett who helped organise the pre-season development days, grant applications as well as providing a wealth of expert up to date information on accreditation and coaching matters.

A special vote of thanks is also extended to the Referee Administrator Michael Backstrom without whose cheerful help appointments, pullouts, member correspondence and a host of other administrative matters would not have progressed in the timely and professional manner they did.

Thanks are also due to Geoff Gardiner, Tim Matthews and Mark Hogan for representing our Association at judicial hearings and appeals. Special mention is afforded to Tim Harland who acted as ARU Citing Commissioner for S12 and Test Matches.

Congratulations to all our Semi-final and Grand Final referees on your appointments and for providing our coaches and assessors many selection headaches due to the high overall standard of your performances. On a sadder note for the year 2001 Geoff Pegg one of our senior referees announced his retirement. On behalf of the Association I would like to thank Geoff for his dedication and unselfish contribution to Queensland refereeing and wish him well in his new rugby life without the whistle.

To members of the Management Committee I am indebted for your dedication, efforts and support throughout the year and the enthusiasm with which you embraced change. The tireless efforts of our Secretary Tim Matthews are particularly noteworthy and his work has set high administrative standards for us all to follow. To our Honorary Auditor Mr Leon Barrett our thanks for your efforts on our behalf.

Next season will present considerable changes and challenges similar to this year has done as the game of rugby completes its evolution from a purely amateur game into a fully professional product. We must accept and adapt to these changes in a positive way and not be backward looking. I am confident that given the huge reservoir of goodwill that exists within our Association we can as a group and as individuals provide direction and leadership to the further development of rugby in Queensland.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to provide accounts which satisfy the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Qld) 1981. The management committee has determined that the Association is a non-reporting entity and therefore there is no requirement to apply Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in the preparation and presentation of these statements.

The statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Qld) 1981. The statements are prepared on a cash basis, whereby items are brought to account as money is paid or received, from the records of the Association. They are based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuation of non-current assets.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated. The following is a summary of significant accounting policies adopted by the Queensland Rugby Referees Association (Brisbane) Inc in the preparation of Financial Statements.

(a) TAXATION

As of 1 July 2000, the association was registered with the ATO for GST purposes. It is a non-profit organization that has voluntarily nominated for GST.

No provision has been made for income tax as the association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income tax Assessment Act.

The Association was and still is not required to have a Tax File Number.

The Association collects and pays GST quarterly. A Business Activity Statements (BAS) is submitted to the ATO on a quarterly basis as required by the Taxation Legislation.

(b) STOCK ON HAND

All inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realizable value.

(c) EQUIPMENT

All equipment purchases are expensed in the year of purchase.

For control purposes such items have been listed on the register of non current assets/chattels.



Scope

I have audited the foregoing special purpose financial report comprising the Statement of Assets and Liabilities and the Statement of Income and Expenditure for the year ended 30 September 2001. The statement comprises pages 1 to 4. The Association's Committee of Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report and the information contained therein, and have determined that the accounting policies used are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the entity's constitution and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion to the members of Queensland Rugby Referees Association (Brisbane) Inc. on its preparation and presentation. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used are appropriate to the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared for distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee of Management's financial reporting requirements under the Association's constitution. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the cash basis of accounting. Statements of Accounting Concepts, Accounting Standards and consensus views of the Urgent Issues Group are not applicable to this special purpose financial reporting adopted by the Association.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Appointments Board Report 2001

The Appointments Board for 2001 consisted of the following personnel:

The Appointments Board met on 7 occasions, approximately every 6 weeks.

There was some modification from the previous year in how the Appointments Board operated. These changes were:

- Referees were placed in 4 pools. Pool 1 was reduced in number. It consisted of the association's top 16 referees. Pool 4 consisted of Sunday BJRU referees.
- Each pool of referees was "managed" by a Referee Pool Manager. The Pool Manager's role included appointments and referee development.
- Each referee pool was also allocated a referee coach coordinator and a number of referee coaches. The referee coach coordinator was to liaise closely with the Pool Manager.
- A pool of experienced referees was formed, a type of "Presidents Panel". These were referees who could do Pool 1 matches, but because of age, family or work commitments, or some other reason, couldn't fulfill the requirements of a Pool 1 referee. These referees were the responsibility of the Pool 1 Manager.
- A representative from the Referees Coaches Group was made a member of the Appointments Board. This provided the Appointments Board with valuable information on the development and performance of all referees.

In general, the appointment process work fairly smoothly during the 2001 season. Michael Backstrom, in his role as Referee Administration Officer, assisted greatly with the smooth running of the appointment process, and Geoff Pegg did an outstanding job with the "pullouts".

Geoff also took over the role of Pool 3 manager, early in the season, when Enrico Rabagliano was forced to retire from this role due to other commitments. Consequently, Geoff did the bulk of the appointments for the QRRA, and for this, the association is deeply indebted.

Terry O'Connor and the Coaches Group provided valuable assistance during the finals. Without the assistance of the Referee Coaches Group in making up part of each Selection panel, the task of selection for finals would have been extremely onerous for the Appointments Board members. With their assistance, all finals referees were seen and given coaching feedback. To all those referee coaches – thank you.

On the representative scene, QRRA Brisbane (Inc) referees acquitted themselves well. Of particular note is Greg Hinton. Greg did not get appointed to a Super 12 match to everyone's disappointment, but managed to become our third active test referee when appointed to a test between PNG and Solomon Islands. Well done Greg.

QRRR Referee Coaching Group

The QRRR Brisbane referee-coaching group met 8 times over the season and spent much time discussing issues relating to coaching. We were fortunate to have Ian Scotney (Chairman of the National Referees Appointments Board), Barry Leask (retired Test referee and appointments officer), Geoff Pegg (1st grade & representative referee and appointments officer) and Peter Smith (Chairman of the Brisbane Appointments Board and retired 1st grade and representative referee) as part of the group.

Peter particularly was able to update us with ARU directions as he was undertaking the first Level III referee-coach course. Barry Leask and Cole Barrett gave us an excellent presentation on "Advantage" earlier in the season and just prior to the grand-final series Ian provided valuable input on the interpretation of match statistics. Geoff Pegg also gave presentations on Touch Judging and Foul Play. Earlier in the year Mick Keogh spent one Sunday morning with us discussing the directions of coaching and positional analysis.

The group consists of 30 coaches, who have written some 234 reports on 116 of our referees. A large number of referees were sighted during the season and observations given verbally rather than in writing.

A special thank you should go to Michael Petrie for the many hours he has devoted to providing videos for coaching purposes. Most Saturday afternoons he filmed and then spent a further 3 – 4 hours copying tapes. It is hoped that next year with the assistance of the newly purchased video-camera and communications gear, funded by the QRU Club, that feedback to referees will be greatly enhanced and Michael will spend less time editing and copying. The purchase of this valuable educational item will enable a large number of games to be taped each weekend and at the conclusion of the match tapes can be passed onto both referee and referee coach.

Next year Laurie Monaghan and Frank Meiklejohn have been invited to participate in the ARU Level III Referee Coach course. Congratulations to both of them. This development will further enhance the strong emphasis this association has on referee coaching.

In conclusion the association owes a great deal to the members of the 2001 Referee Coaches for their on-going contribution to improving refereeing standards over the year.

The ICU Group is a specific referee development group designed to provide identified individuals with intensive coaching beyond the normal coaching and referee development. These individuals have in the past been identified by various means. After much discussion we have aligned the ICU (as a sub-group) with the Coaching Group and have asked that body to identify and invite individuals to attend the various sessions that are held.

At the first meeting for the year we asked that each of the participants commit themselves to the ICU by:

- Attendance at all of the ICU Meetings;
- Attendance at fitness training sessions (at least once per week);
- Attendance at Monthly General Meetings; and
- Supporting the other ICU Members by actively participating in the various discussions (including those that required preparation prior to attendance).

This year there were 13 meetings held with discussion topics and presentations covering No.4 & No.5 responsibilities, Touch Judging, Obstruction, The Tackle, Scrum, Communication (Whistle-Signal-Talk), Management/Conflict Resolution, Advantage, Foul Play, Ruck & Maul, Off-side, Line-out and rounding off the year with another session on Touch Judging. Every presentation was of a high calibre with a lot of work preparing overheads, handouts, questionnaires and Power Point displays evident.

The meetings were split into 3 parts

- Presentation/Discussion Group/Seminar
(this included a law component, a management component and a safety component)
- A Law discussion (where appropriate); and
- A general discussion on our games and any issues that may have arisen since we last met.

On average we had 12 participants (out of a possible 16) at the various sessions, which indicated a high level of commitment from the individuals involved. In addition we were graced with the presence of a number of visitors including our visiting referees, Ian Scotney (iRB and ARU Coach/Assessor) and our Australian Panel Referees.

Thank you to all who participated and contributed to the success of the Group this year. From Laurie and Frank we wish you all a safe and happy Christmas and New Year and look forward to seeing everyone at training prior to the start of the 2002 season.

Interchange Report 2001

The year saw a significantly reduced interchange program than those of the previous few seasons, with further reductions envisaged for next year.

A reduction of funding has meant that outgoing exchanges were limited to Wellington and Christchurch, however it is unanimously agreed that these are the best two places to serve our Association's needs, as can be seen from the separate reports by Paul Marks (Christchurch) and Franz Nohreiter (Wellington) which follow:-

Christchurch

On Friday July 20, Tim Matthews, Jonathan Cichero and I left Brisbane for Mission Canterbury. On arrival at Christchurch International Airport we were greeted with 2 Degree heat with a minus 10 wind chill factor. After short introductions Phil Turnock drove us to the home of John and Pam Adams. Most of the QRRA members that have ever been to Canterbury would not only know John and Pam but would also have stayed with them. I call them the Mum and Dad of the QRRA Christchurch Inc! We were quickly shown the door by John so he could take us to his favourite raffles on Friday night at the local. The fact that the Bar staff wear no tops has nothing to do with these raffles being John's favourite. Tim, Jonathan and I begrudgingly followed our host. On return to the house not only had the three ring-ins won all the raffles but also cleaned out the local SP bookie.

The following morning we awoke to the news that the South Island was in the grip of a cold snap and snow was falling at record rates in the mountains. Christchurch was pleasant at -6 degrees. On that first Saturday, Jonathan was appointed to a third division game by the sea, Tim went with John to coach one of John's up and coming referees and then to watch Kahu Carey in the Preliminary Final of their First Division, and I was given a Colts 1 game at Hagley Park. I arrived at my game an hour and a half early and there was not a soul around. I thought the game may have been called off due to the inclement weather, but was quickly told that no-one will turn up until about 15 minutes before kick-off because of the cold. The game I refereed was of a very high standard, and the HSOB side produced some of the best mauling skills I have ever seen, including one continuous rolling maul that went from the 10 meter line on the other side of halfway to a try 60 meters up field. (I was even questioned by the opposition about "obstruction" during that movement, and I asked the player concerned when he thought the obstruction occurred - his response was all the way up the field. I then educated him that that was a maul.) My game started with rain and by full time that rain was very cold and hard but not snow as I was told.

That evening we all went to the Referee Club rooms at Jade Stadium where we performed the traditional Bundy Rum drinking session, with two 2 litre bottles that our own 'Buddah' made us buy duty free. The QRRA put on a very impressive display!

This evening started what Coach Matthews classified as the "bench mark" of pre match preparations. He had a schoolboy game pencilled in for him the following day at 3.30pm, so he drank plenty of that Bundy, smoked plenty of cigarettes and got to bed about

4.30am after watching the once mighty All Blacks beat South Africa 12-6 in the first Tri-Nations game refereed by our own Scott Young. Next morning, John Adams informed the Budd that, in fact, the game was an international Japan Schoolboys visiting team v St Bedes 1st XV. Serious pre match began in earnest with at least another carton of cigarettes and much coffee. Upon arrival at 2:45pm, Tim was told that the game had been rescheduled to 3.00pm. Cool, calm and collected, Tim and his Japanese speaking (lucky) touch judge spoke to the visiting side and then ran on for his fastest (and only) jog of the day. On the Wednesday Jonathan and I had more schoolboy games. Jonathan had a First VX game, and I the under 15 curtain raiser to the big schoolboy game of the year, Christ College V Christchurch Boys High. Tim was the coach for Vinny Munro one of Canterbury's NPC referees, that refereed the big game.

On the Thursday again with Phil Turnock we visited a local tourist town called Akaroa. It is a little French seaside village with magnificent hills surrounding it. Another great day out. On the Friday Jonathan had organized a trip for us to Mt Hutt, the local ski fields. Seeing that 4 days earlier Mt Hutt had the second biggest snow dump in its history, we just had to hit the slopes. Tim even much to his displeasure had a go. While Jonathan and I were carving up Mt Hutt, Budd was taking lessons on how to get up off the snow and how to fall back down again. After a magnificent day at the snow we were early to bed at the house of our new hosts, David and Sue McBrearty.

That evening after a quick drink at the Club rooms we were taken to dinner by our hosts, the president of the CRRRA and John and Pam Adams. We decided for an early night as our flight home was at 6am and the Wallabies were playing the Springboks at 3am-our hosts revelled in the result.

Tim, Jonathan and I had a wonderful time and learned a lot about Rugby during our stay in Christchurch. I am sure that Jonathan and I are better referees because of our interchange, and that Tim is a better coach. We would all like to thank the QRRRA Brisbane for giving us the opportunity to go on a wonderful tour and also to the CRRRA for a fantastic week of Rugby and sightseeing. The organization behind our tour at the CRRRA end was nothing short of superb, and is why the Canterbury interchange is one of the best interchanges any QRRRA member will go on.

Wellington

Mark Logan and I arrived in Wellington late on the Friday night, in preparation for a true Rugby experience. "Windy Wellington" however did not truly describe the weather: "Windy, Sleety, Squally, Arctic, Hurricainy Wellington" is a bit closer to the mark. The only way of describing the strength of the wind is to imagine spectators standing at 45 degrees, and penalty attempts being converted at 60 meters. That first day saw Mark and I both referee senior division 4 games, about the equivalent of a good third grade game. Mark was also thrown in with an early morning colts 2 game – just to get the blood flowing.

Sunday saw my first 1st XV game, a local college team playing a touring side from San Diego in California. Again the weather was not our traditional dry and warm winter, but a good game none-the-less.

The Wellington Referee's Association meeting is held on a Monday evening, and this is where Mark and I were introduced to the association. The meeting was broken up into different discussion groups depending on your appointment pool, and areas such as the breakdown and scrums were discussed on this occasion. Lyndon Bray was the convenor of one group, and many may remember him from his previous role with the ARU. He had just been appointed to his first test match in a Papua New Guinea tournament, and as such saw fit to shout the bar at his local referee's meeting. May be a good way of increasing our attendances at meeting nights?

Tuesday Mark and I were taken for a drive up to Palmerston North, to the New Zealand Rugby College – a sort of AIS for Rugby in New Zealand; Wednesday Mark had a schools first XV game, while I was a "Number 4"; then Thursday we had the equivalent of Primary school games. I refereed a grade seven 1st XV game, while Mark refereed a grade six 2nd XV. Even at this level, the games were 15 players a side, playing 30 minute halves with injury time. These kids are serious about their Rugby!

Friday night football under lights was exciting – some very high standard 1st XV games for both of us. It isn't until you find yourself standing in the middle of 30, testosterone filled 17 year-olds screaming their school haka's at each other from a distance of 1 meter, that you realise you might be refereeing a slightly intense game of Rugby. Hard to find that in Brisbane.

Saturday brought more games of Rugby (we were getting a bit tired by now), Mark had a senior division 2 game, and then ran touch for the premier division game, while I handled a senior division 4 game. The farewell dinner was that same evening, and Mark and I were both pleased to be given the opportunity to stop drinking beer for a while once the dinner was over. The Kiwi's know how to look after their referee's after a game, and we had a lot of games!

Finally, Mark and I would like to extend our deepest thanks to the QRRA and Wellington referee's associations for providing us with such a fantastic opportunity. I personally feel honoured to have been given this chance to improve my skills.

The QRRA Brisbane still managed to host 10 in-coming referees this year, and no end of thanks must be extended to all those referees and their families who went out of their way to

billet our guests. Most were not involved in the school holiday carnivals, so this only placed an extra burden on those looking after them. Again, many thanks.

The management committee has decided that in-coming exchanges will be further curtailed next year, to limit the load on our association. We shall endeavour to accept two emerging referees from Wellington, a first grade and second grade referee from Christchurch, and possibly an assessor/coach from Christchurch. The in-coming referees will be hopefully here for the carnival season in the June/July holidays. This should allow for a greater number of local referees to be involved in these carnivals and receive extra coaching, instead of being taken up by foreign referees.

Our out-going exchange will mirror the in-coming exchange, however it is hoped that this should occur earlier in our season – possibly around the Easter break. This would allow out-going referees the opportunity to put the intensive “coaching” into good practice before seasons end.

Once again thank you to all those who assisted in every way this year, helping our local members improve their refereeing, and fostering a closer union in Rugby across the Tasman.

Judiciary Report 2001

Unusual admissions of guilt for significant atrocities helped balance the scales of credibility.

Our thanks go to the people prepared to give up their time in the interests of Rugby. On the Judiciary Committee we were represented by Geoff Gardiner and Tim Matthews, while the Appeals Committee saw the following people assisting: Tim Harland, Tim Matthews, Keith Jennings, Graham Sheehan OAM and Mark Hogan.

In the main, the standard of Send-off Reports from referees were acceptable. Referees are urged again to place sufficient importance on this activity to present a high quality document to the Committee, as in many ways it can reflect on the professional nature of the Association. We must continue to urge people to present the pertinent facts in a precise and concise manner. It makes the task of the Committee that much easier. Thank you to those Referees (and they are in the majority) who have done this, keep up the good work. Below is a summary of send-offs and penalties awarded for the year.

Junior Judiciary Report 2001

The Brisbane Junior Rugby Union Judiciary was required to consider 27 send-off reports received from Association members during the 2001 season. The majority of those reports resulted in players appearing before the Judiciary to receive appropriate suspensions, except in the lower age groups where offences of a more minor nature attract an automatic suspension without the need to appear before the Judiciary. As a result of the send-off reports, players were suspended for a total of 59 weeks, plus in one case a player was banned for the entire 2002 season.

After a substantial number of send-offs in the early part of the year, particularly in the under 17 pre-season competition, the number of Judiciary appearances became more isolated mid-season before increasing again as the various semi-finals and finals took place. It is probably no coincidence that the majority of send-offs occurred at times when the school competitions were not taking place.

I understand that a substantial review of the interface between club and school competitions, and the resulting send-off penalties, will be undertaken by the Brisbane Club Competition Committee during the off-season.

The season low point from the Judiciary's perspective was the challenge by an under 13 player against an automatic one week send-off suspension that prevented the player from participating in his team's grand final.

A 4 page appeal notice was served on the player's behalf, and a barrister presented substantive argument, video evidence and 8 witness statements during a 3 hour appeal hearing. The appeal was unsuccessful, but during the hearing and afterwards when various checks were conducted, it appeared that the player may have been sent off on up to 5 previous occasions during the 2001 season. The player was able to present to the Judiciary as a "cleanskin", as the prior send-offs were comprised by 3 during school competition (not taken into account) and 2 in club games (1 "downgraded to a yellow card" by the referee after the game, and the other not being the subject of a written send-off report). This example highlights the need for all referees to be diligent in completing send-off reports and submitting them to the Referee Administration Manager within the nominated time periods.
