PRESIDENT'S REPORT - 2011

Apart from the opportunity to see Rugby played between those Rugby Nations whom have achieved entry into the Rugby World Cup a year in which the Webb Ellis Trophy is competed for also brings with it little change in the Laws of the Game. This provides therefore an opportunity to consolidate on the manner in which we as individuals manage our matches. To this end when the Game Management Document for 2011 was received that document served to reinforce what had been promulgated in 2010.

As usual we provided the opportunity for our match officials to hear from the higher level practitioners and those involved in the early season Rugby Super 15 on just what management issues were to be addressed in the lead up to the Rugby World Cup and from coaching reports undertaken by our Referee Coaches it was apparent that our membership were using such insights in their matches to try to encourage a better standard of Rugby. Despite this we did have some issues where clubs and more specifically some coaches considered referee performance to be below standard however where we had access to DVD of matches and had a second look it was found that the issue revolved around interpretational differences. It is also the case that some coaches/ team officials/ spectators do not have patience where we have a learner referee and fail to grasp that just as young players need to learn so to do young referees.

In the past three years we have actively encouraged young club players, school students and those with an interest who no longer wish to play to become match officials and as a result we have 16% of our membership now aged under 20 years. This will provide a pool of experienced referees moving through the ranks in the coming years and will be a good number to offset future losses. It was a very pleasing outcome to see Ben Dorrington-Plumb, Declan Lane and Melinda Volker receive recognition and an award at the Annual Dinner.

It is worth repeating that the QRRA is in a rather unique position in that its members are appointed to all levels of Rugby played in Brisbane. Once again we have officiated at 4088 matches and this was achieved against a background of some annual events not being played in 2011. I understand that although there were some strains with all of the school competitions progressing at the same time we were helped through this period through the recruitment of forty three (43) new match officials. One thing about Queensland is that we are never short of people moving in or back. Next year the GPS competition will move to term three however it is probably the case that GPS trials will occur at the back end of the AIC and TAS season.

This year our Referee Coaches have completed 374 coaching reports. Whilst the BJRU area was well covered we still have some work to do to achieve an adequate coverage of those involved with Senior (lower grade) and Schools Rugby. This is where we need more coaches with senior experience to assist in the process. The difficulty here is that many of Referee Coaches who can assist are still active referees and there is a conflict between the match level that they are appointed to and the positioning of the match officials whom need a report. That is on the agenda to be addressed in 2012.

Once again we gained recognition at the National Level with a number of our membership being involved in RS15 and national Championships. In all cases we received encouraging feedback on the level of performance achieved by our members.

I am sure that you will be aware by now that Scott Young has been given a role with iRB Sevens circuit to drive the strategic development of match officiating at the Sevens tournament. Additionally Matt O'Brien recently was appointed to the Australia v New Zealand Schoolboys International and has been included by the iRB as a referee for the iRB Sevens Circuit. I am sure that you all will join with me in congratulating them on gaining this recognition and wish them a successful journey in their endeavours.

I might say that 2011 has been a difficult year for me in juggling all of my commitments. As you will all know my working circumstances take me for long periods of time to Perth and as such I do not consider that it is fair to the QRRA Committee for me not to be available for the day to administration of the QRRA. For that reason I am standing down as President. However I feel that there is still a lot

of things that I set as my goals that I have not completed and I wish to work hard with the Committee to achieve those goals and those issues that I wish to address can be achieved through being Vice-President. I have a belief in the QRRA and consider that it can be looked upon as a leader in all things that are part of being a match official and with the support of the membership I feel that I can make a significant contribution to the QRRA well into the future.

I would again wish to acknowledge my appreciation for the support we receive from the Queensland Rugby Union, Queensland Suburban Rugby Union, Brisbane Junior Rugby Union, Queensland Junior Rugby Union GPS Schools, AIC Schools and the TAS Schools. For the support of our Sponsors – Queensland Rugby Club, Coopers Plains Dental Group and Laudistons we are most grateful.

I would also like to thank the members of the Management Committee for their efforts during 2011 and those who have accepted positions outside of that Committee that contribute to the smooth and efficient running of the group as a whole. It would be remiss of me not to pass on my thanks to Mark Hogan who filled in for me on many occasions during the year and Paul Heath who keeps the QRRA ticking over so efficiently.

In conclusion I would like to again repeat last years final paragraph - It goes without saying that to be a Rugby match official requires an outstanding commitment to achieve the level of expectation that our stakeholders in the game expect. I believe that again in 2011 that the QRRA has gone beyond that expectation and to our individual members I would like to thank you all for that commitment. In 2012 we will again need to be ever ready to meet new challenges, and be better at what we already do well now. Being a match official in this sport involves being part of an evolution and that is the challenge for us that we must stay abreast of.

Appointments Board Report 2011

In 2011 the Association appointed and provided referees to 4089 matches, including more than 1000 in the QRU Grade Competition/Grade Trials/Invitational, 1772 in the Brisbane Junior Rugby Union Competition and 592 in the GPS, AIC and TAS Competitions as well as a number of requested games. Two hundred and forty one (241) members of the Association were appointed to games this year. A further 19 visitors from other Associations were accommodated with games.

The Appointments Board was comprised by Greg Cuthbert, Michael Wallace, Neil Lavery and by myself, as Chairman. Greg was responsible for Senior appointments throughout the 2011 season, whilst Neil assumed responsibility for the Junior appointments from Michael soon after the commencement of the season.

I take this opportunity, on behalf of all QRRA members, to thank Greg, Michael and Neil for their efforts throughout the season in what is clearly a very difficult and time consuming obligation. The usual range of duties provides more than enough work for the Appointments Officers, given that they need to be conscious of matters relating to particular teams, schools, venues and the requirements of our members as well.

The most difficult part of the job remains the effort arising from withdrawals by members after the release of appointments and, as always, we seek the co-operation of all members in ensuring that these are restricted to a minimum.

I would also like to thank our Executive Officer, Paul Heath, for his continued effort in ensuring that virtually 100% of games were able to commence with an appointed referee present (including substantial effort by Paul in keeping up this impressive standard during his absence in England with his family in August).

Thanks must also go to all members who were able to accept replacement or additional appointments at short notice and, in particular, those referees who remained at a venue and completed an additional game resulting from a "no-show" by the appointed referee.

Efforts are continuing to streamline the processes involved with appointments and, once the new website is in place, we believe that it will be possible to make greater use of technology to assist the appointment officers with their various duties.

In closing, I confirm that Greg Cuthbert will be standing down as Senior Appointments Officer after three years in that role. During that time, Greg demonstrated extremely impressive organisational abilities and a wide knowledge of all aspects of the subject matter required to allow decision-making as to the most appropriate referee for each of the many games covered by him. Greg has assured me that this "intellectual property" will not be lost to the Association and he will provide every assistance to the replacement Senior Appointments Officer to allow this important work to continue along the same lines as the standard which has now been established by Greg.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2011

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to provide accounts which satisfy the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (QId) 1981. The management committee has determined that the Association is a non-reporting entity and therefore there is no requirement to apply accounting standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in the preparation and presentation of these statements.

The statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Old) 1981. The statements are prepared on a cash basis, whereby items are bought to account as money is paid or received, from the records of the association. These are based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where as specifically stated, current valuation of non-current assets.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated. The following is a summary of significant accounting policies adopted by the Queensland Rugby Referees Association (Brisbane) Incorporated in the preparation of the financial statements.

(a) Taxation

As of 1 July 2000, the association was registered with the ATO for GST purposes. It is a nonprofit organisation that has voluntarily nominated for GST.

No provision has been made for income tax as the association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

The Association was and still is not required to have a Tax File Number.

The Association collects and pays GST quarterly. A Business Activity Statement (BAS) is submitted to the ATO on a quarterly basis as required by the taxation legislation.

(b) Stock on Hand

All bar stock and referee's apparel are expensed in the year of purchase.

(c) Equipment

All equipment purchases are expensed in the year of purchase.

For control purposes such items have been listed on the register of non-current assets/chattels.

(d) Events subsequent to Balance Date

Significant items of income and expenditure subsequent to balance date but prior to AGM are noted in Note 13.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(f) Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report of Queensland Rugby Referees Association (Brisbane) Inc, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2011, the statement of comprehensive income and statement of cash flows for the year ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The committee of the association is responsible for the preparation of the financial report, and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 to the financial report is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (QLD) 1981 and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. Referee Coaching and Mentoring

The Association faces the same challenges as any business in meeting demands in its training and development function – in our case, the referee coaching and mentoring programs with the major challenges faced by QRRA being:

- There are very scarce resources with major dilemma of where to apply these to get the "best bang for your buck".
- As indicated in prior years, there are competing demands within rugby itself such as some coaches still being active referees and time restraints to be able to dedicate to coaching which often ends up being the activity foregone.
- Referees at different stages of their careers as well as having different learning styles and motivation levels. This in turn means a wide range of coaching styles need to be applied to meet the needs of both the Association and members – there is no "one size fits all" approach that will work right across a diverse Association such as ours.
- The ever increasing compliance and accreditation requirements of ensuring that referees are operating at sufficient base levels necessitate that coaching resources are diverted towards this function eg to maintain level 1 or 2 accreditation, field tests are required to be completed every 4 years.
- Getting the balance right between providing for the "here and now" and "tomorrow" with the reality being that both come back to working with appointments board members ensuring that referees are being placed in the most appropriate games.
- Given that our stakeholders are required to pay for refereeing services, this has raised their expectations and the Association needs to demonstrate that we are meeting their needs.

With all of these often competing constraints, it was recognized that a more segmented approach would be required during the 2011 season. To this end, referee coaching and mentoring was structured on 3 levels using business based principles with different programs designed to meet the specific needs of each group.

Junior Program:

This approach in this program used the same principles that would be used for those starting in jobs. This is based on entry level training being particularly instructional in nature with frequent follow ups to ensure that skills had been learnt and applied with the specific aim of these referees attaining basic skill levels (ie building competency) and then being able to promote them into more challenging games (ie talent identification).

A system of appointments of referee coaches to view games of identified referees and provide immediate feedback in both written and verbal forms was put in place and this was closely managed by Paul Evans whose efforts were recognized this year receiving the Trevor Henry Memorial Award for services to junior rugby.

Pat Rae, this year's winner of the Duffell Jones Award for contribution to referee development is to be congratulated for the work he has done as part of the referee program with Sunnybank Rugby Club. This local based program builds on the principles of the previous BJRU program targeting young players. The success of this program can be measured by the fact that the conversion rate was double that for similar programs

Referee Squads:

In business terms, the referee squad program was based on principles of management training programs. Organisations of our size (business or otherwise) invariably have similar development programs in place and we would be remiss in our responsibilities if these were not in place. This year's

program aimed to continue to build on the efforts of the previous years with a particular emphasis on making the participants more self sufficient. The key elements were:

Effective Mentoring

Referees had input into who they would prefer as their mentor. They were encouraged to have weekly dialogue to set goals/solve problems and have match reviews. This also meant that coaching this year became more targeted with specific coaches with less reports provided and therefore more resources could then be dedicated to Community Rughy.

Physical Training

All were encouraged to attend regular QRRA training sessions with these supplemented by Monday fortnightly sessions arranged with the ARU Trainer to whom we owe our thanks. A fitness test was conducted mid season. Unfortunately special sprint training was unable to be organized this year.

Specific Education

Two key education sessions on scrums and TRM were conducted assisted with visual presentations prepared by the ARU. Thanks to Tony Darcy, Steve Walsh and Andrew Cole for their assistance for these most effective presentations with results carried onto the field.

Building Confidence

Encouragement was given to participants to "be their own self" and not to rely on others to solve their problems ie taking responsibility for their decisions and to think clearly and work through processes. Some of the younger referees have made strong headway in these areas.

Support

Much of the support for this group has come from within themselves characterized through teamwork such as presence at each others matches and social networking. Messrs Mitchelmore/Moore/Hills are to be complimented on how they have encouraged the group

Thanks to Geoff Pegg, Peter Gofton and Peter Smith for their assistance in coordination of the squads.

Community Program:

The approach for the Community Program (grades and schools) is in many ways opposite to that of the Junior program in that the basic premises that referees at this level are performing at the required level of competency for the games to which they have been appointed and that enjoyment of the game by these referees is just as paramount so as to increase their longevity for the Association. In business terms, this is akin to the organization allowing their senior operators to get on with the job but at the same time ensuring that they remain competent to do so.

With these aims in mind, the coaching program was based on the following using the same appointments based methodology as the junior program including the use of senior experienced referees for sightings as well as referee coaches:

- Formal Coaching Reports providing written and verbal feedback to the referees.
- Accreditation competency reports (ie to enable referees to maintain their current level 1/2 competencies).
- Sighting reports with subsequent feedback to appointments officer that referee was indeed appropriate for their appointed games.
- Informal feedback

This is a very pleasing result for a number of reasons:

- These do not include account sightings and informal feedback provided which were prominent in 2011.
- We have again increased the number of reports despite the limitations around resourcing we are now providing 105% more coaching reports than what we were doing some 5 years ago.
- Reports were provided over a much wider referee audience with less reports written for specific referees as a result of mentoring program in place.

Congratulations to all referees and referee coaches who have been appointed to Representative fixtures and championships at a National and State levels.

We would also like to thank all referee coaches and mentors for the support they were able to give in 2011. Your efforts were greatly appreciated and particularly by the referees themselves who in the main were very positive about the advice and feedback provided.

Interchange Report 2011

Our Referee Interchange Program offers valuable opportunities for QRRA members to experience refereeing and the rugby culture in other areas within Queensland and in New Zealand. Over the years, we have earned an enviable reputation for returning the hospitality provided to QRRA referees by their hosts, to visiting referees from intrastate and overseas. This year, in a variety of ways we have supported visits not just from our traditional Kiwi mates, but referees from other countries such as England and Scotland as well. It reminds us that rugby is truly an international game and reinforces the camaraderie between players and referees from all nations.

This year, we hosted visiting referees from Christchurch, Wellington, Hawkes Bay and Northland.
