

PRESIDENT'S REPORT - 2012

Following on from the highlights of the 2011 Rugby Season in Australia (with the Reds as Super Rugby Champions and the Wallabies as Tri-Nations Champions and World Cup Semi-Finalists), the 2012 season was a more difficult assignment for our State and National representative teams.

However, the standards displayed in the majority of the competitions that our members were appointed to in 2012 suffered little by comparison with preceding seasons. In particular, the QRU Grade Finals series and the GPS Schools First XV competition produced some very entertaining games of the highest quality.

I believe that the efforts of our members, at all levels of rugby that they are appointed to, contributed to this process; we are aware that some sectors of the rugby community can be quick to criticise refereeing performances, but it was particularly pleasing to note a sharp downturn in the number of complaints made against our members this year. In the context of the 4,464 games that our members were appointed to in season 2012, the complaints were minimal (and, where justified, a suitable response was quickly provided to the Club or team involved to demonstrate that we appreciated their feedback).

A number of factors contributed to the apparent improvement in our refereeing standards, including wide participation in both formal and informal mentoring programs, and the efforts of our referee coaches – a number of our more recently appointed coaches were very active indeed (resulting in the efforts of Craig Taylor and Paul Towler being recognised at our recent Awards Dinner).

Australian Rugby Union Initiatives

Without going into a lot of technical detail, members will be aware that the QRRA is affiliated with the Queensland Rugby Union, which in turn is an affiliate of the ARU. The high performance division of the ARU, in its ongoing efforts to develop referees for appointment to SANZAR and iRB regulated matches, introduced the concept of the Premier Panel of 22 referees to control all first grade matches in Sydney and premier rugby matches in Brisbane throughout the 2012 season. The concept is centred around putting referees into situations where they referee unfamiliar teams at unfamiliar grounds with different assistant referee personnel than would apply in their home State – this resulted in a significant amount of interchange of referees during the season between the 14 Sydney based members and the 8 Brisbane based members of the Premier Panel.

I understand that the arrangement worked very well throughout the season and I commend the efforts of our participants, being National Panel members, Rohan Hoffman, Damian Mitchelmore, Simon Moore and Matt O'Brien, as well as the other Premier Panel members John Christopherson, Andrew Coorey, John Corry and Paul Haydock (with Luke Moloney joining the panel later in the season following injury and unavailability of other members).

The ARU also decided that all 39 finals in the top three grades in Brisbane and Sydney would be refereed only by the 14 National Panel referees. Whilst of course we congratulate all participants on their appointments during those finals series, the Management Committee of the QRRA is of the view that this initiative may have been overly restrictive on our ability to advance the development of some of our other members with appointments to the finals series in Brisbane, and we suggest that it may be appropriate for the ARU to give some consideration to the balance between these objectives in planning for the 2013 season.

The ARU also made it clear prior to the commencement of the 2012 season that ongoing reaccreditation of referees would require the preparation of a Competency Report on all referees (who are reaccredited after a four year period). Effectively, this results in each of our referees being reviewed once during a four year term and is therefore seen as a very positive result in terms of being able to maintain and improve refereeing standards throughout our entire membership. Given the number of QRRA members, approximately 70 to 80 accreditations and reaccreditations will need

to be performed each year on an ongoing basis, which will obviously place a greater importance on the efforts of our referee coaches (in season 2012, 71 such accreditation reports were prepared, and arrangements are in place for this program to be rolled out into the 2013 season as soon as possible).

Early in 2012, the ARU distributed and updated an improved video presentation of the Game Management Guidelines, which was presented by Damian Mitchelmore to a group of over 100 of our members at Gregory Terrace school prior to the commencement of the 2012 season. We have represented to the ARU Referee Education Manager, Jamie McGregor, that more high quality resources of this nature would be appreciated to allow us to communicate effectively with our wide membership in a consistent manner. An ARU rugby conference focusing on education and referee coaching matters will be held in Sydney in late November and a member of our Management Committee will participate in those discussions.

Queensland Rugby Union

During late 2011 and early 2012, I appreciated the efforts of Michael Backstrom in arranging and coordinating meetings with the QRU Community Rugby Head, David Hanham and Section Leaders Rob Donoghue, Scott Oakhill and Reg Roberts, who outlined the new management structure for community rugby in Queensland, and then proceeded to work very co-operatively with the QRRA during the 2012 season. In particular, I thank Rob Donoghue for his efforts as Chair of the State Referee Committee, as well as Geoff Pegg for his efforts on that committee and for Lachlan Parkinson, who co-ordinated the education courses presented by the QRU.

Referee Education

I recognise that the QRRA education program was curtailed to some extent this year as the result of a number of factors (including an increase in emphasis on individual mentoring, and the need to conduct competency reports associated with accreditation). However, during the year there were various meetings conducted for new referees; referees regularly engaged in Sunday games for the Brisbane Junior Rugby Union; and the Community Rugby Referees Group.

Following further consultation with the ARU and QRU regarding their education initiatives, a member of the Management Committee will take on the responsibility to schedule regular education meetings for our members during the 2013 season.

Member and Stakeholder Acknowledgements

I wish to formally acknowledge our appreciation for the support that we received from the QRU, Queensland Suburban Rugby Union, Brisbane Junior Rugby Union, Queensland Junior Rugby Union, as well as GPS Schools, AIC Schools and the TAS Schools.

We thank Coopers Plains Dental Group and Slattery Auctions for their ongoing sponsorship support of the QRRA. Unfortunately, as members will be aware, our principal sponsor the Queensland Rugby Club was placed in receivership during the 2012 season, which will require some re-alignment of the QRRA budget in the short-term, and result in increased efforts to identify alternative sponsorship opportunities during the forthcoming season.

As mentioned at the recent Awards Dinner, only about 10% of the games that our members are appointed to could be regarded as "premium level" games, with the vast majority being junior games, lower grade school games and community rugby matches. I understand that 261 referees have been recorded as completing matches as members of the QRRA during the 2012 season, with 54 new referees included in those statistics – I take this opportunity to thank each of those referees for their time and effort during the 2012 year.

At the risk of missing any significant achievements or efforts by our members, in which case I apologise in advance for the oversight, I acknowledge the following:

- 1. Super Rugby Appointments for Rohan Hoffman, Damian Mitchelmore, Simon Moore and Steve Leszczynski.
- 2. Matt O'Brien and Scott Young for their appointments to the iRB Rugby Sevens program.
- 3. All of our members appointed to representative games and the recent Finals Series, as mentioned elsewhere in this Report.
- 4. Our long suffering Appointments Officers Neill McCann (Seniors and Schools) and Neil Lavery (Juniors).
- 5. Our referee coaches, who were responsible for preparation of more than 320 reports during the 2012 season (in addition, I would like to acknowledge the efforts of our senior referee coaches who were appointed by the ARU on a weekly basis to provide feedback to Brisbane and Sydney referees appointed to premier rugby games in Brisbane, most of which did not result in preparation of a specific report).
- 6. Other major award winners for 2012 including Tim Clough (Best First Year Referee), Cameron Foley (Best First Year Junior Referee), Shaun Rigby (Most Improved Referee), and Michael Lucas (RM Bendeich Trophy winner as referee of the Under 15 Division 1 Grand Final).
- 7. 2012 retirees, including the end of season retirees acknowledged at the Awards Dinner (John McCarthy, Tom Ryan and Rex Martin), as well as Bryce Titcume, who retired during the 2012 season.
- 8. Our representatives on the Senior Judiciary (Geoff Gardiner) and BJRU Judiciary (Michael Wallace).
- 9. The members of the Management Committee who gave so much time and performed their roles so well to ensure that management of all facets of the QRRA operations continued at a high level (including in particular Paul Evans for his ongoing work with the development of junior referees and referee coaches; Andrew Macintosh for his control of the interchange program for the Association; and Treasurer Dan Sheahan for his contribution to the financial wellbeing of the Association in these difficult economic times). The contribution over a number of years made by Luke Spence to the QRRA and the Management Committee of Luke Spence is recognised. Luke will not be standing for the Committee for 2013 and has juggled a demanding career with this contribution most ably.
- 10. Of course, last but by no means least, our Executive Officer Paul Heath who has again contributed to the QRRA in many and varied ways, most of which are well beyond his official "job description".

In conclusion, it is clear from my observations and discussions with many of our members during the 2012 season that we are a diverse group with different aims and objectives, but I have a real sense of the friendship and respect that exists between large numbers of our membership group. I trust that all members enjoyed the 2012 season, and I look forward to an even better year in 2013.

Appointments Board Report 2012

The 2012 season saw two significant changes which had direct impact on the appointments for the Association. Firstly, all Premier appointments were made on a National basis with Brisbane referees travelling to Sydney on a regular basis and Sydney based referees coming to referee our Premier competition. This also was extended to appointments to the finals for Premier, Premier Colts and Division 1- 1st Grade which were made from the national referee panels. The second impact came as a result of move of rugby to the 3rd term by the GPS Schools competition. Whilst this had a positive effect in the traditional May/June busy period with referees not having to double up as had occurred in previous seasons, it meant that the final few rounds of this competition coincided with the finals in the Brisbane grade competitions. The end result of both of these was that there were restrictions in the number of referees who could be appointed to finals panels.

In terms of numbers, in 2011 the Association appointed and provided referees to 4464 matches, including more than 1050 in the QRU Grade Competition, 2100 in the Brisbane Junior Rugby Union Competition and 563 in the GPS, AIC and TAS school based competitions as well as 823 requested games. 246 members of the Association were appointed to games this year. A further 17 visitors from other Associations were accommodated with games.

The Appointments Board was comprised of Brian O'Donnell (Chairman), Neill McCann (Senior and School appointments) and Neil Lavery (Juniors), ably assisted by Paul Heath, our Executive Officer, whose dedicated efforts ensured that virtually 100% of games were able to commence with an appointed referee present.

I take this opportunity, on behalf of all QRRA members, to thank Neill, Paul and Neil for their efforts throughout the season in what is clearly a very difficult and time consuming obligation. The usual range of duties provides more than enough work for the Appointments Officers, given that they need to be conscious of matters relating to particular teams, schools, venues and the requirements of our members as well. I would also like Geoff Pegg for his assistance in ensuring that Premier and Representatives were co-ordinated smooth with those of the Association. Thanks also to the referee coaches who provided feedback on members to the Appointments Officers to ensure that appointments continue to be made at the appropriate levels.

The most difficult challenge of the appointments roles continues to be the effort required as a result of withdrawals by members after the release of appointments and, as always, we seek the cooperation of all members in ensuring that these are restricted to a minimum. Thanks must also go to all members who were able to accept replacement or additional appointments at short notice and, in particular, those referees who remained at a venue and completed an additional game resulting from a "no-show" by the appointed referee.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2012

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (QId) 1981. The management committee has determined that the Association is a not a reporting entity.

The financial report have been prepared on a cash basis, whereby items are bought to account as money is paid or received, from the records of the association. These are based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where as specifically stated, current valuation of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies have been consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of the financial report.

(a) Income Tax

As of 1 July 2000, the association was registered with the ATO for GST purposes. It is a nonprofit organisation that has voluntarily nominated for GST.

No provision has been made for income tax as the association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

The Association was and still is not required to have a Tax File Number.

The Association collects and pays GST quarterly. A Business Activity Statement (BAS) is submitted to the ATO on a quarterly basis as required by the taxation legislation.

(b) Stock on Hand

All bar stock and referee's apparel are expensed in the year of purchase.

(c) Equipment

All equipment purchases are expensed in the year of purchase.

For control purposes such items have been listed on the register of non-current assets/chattels.

(d) Events subsequent to Balance Date

Significant items of income and expenditure subsequent to balance date but prior to AGM are noted in Note 13.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(f) Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF QUEENSLAND RUGBY REFEREES ASSOCIATION (BRISBANE) INC.

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report of Queensland Rugby Referees Association (Brisbane) Inc, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2012, the statement of comprehensive income and statement of cash flows for the year ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The committee of the association is responsible for the preparation of the financial report, and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 to the financial report is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (QLD) 1981 and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The committee's responsibility also includes such internal control as the officers determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We have conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. Referee Coaching Report

In 2011 a complete overview of the methodology to be used in the coaching of referees was included as part of that year's Annual report. In 2012 the only change from that methodology resulted from the decision of the Australian Rugby Union High Performance Unit to appoint match officials at a National Level to the Sydney and Brisbane Premier Grade competitions. As part of that process a number of Referee Coaches with that level of experience were selected to view and report on the Premier Grade matches.

This initiative in no way impacted on the processes that were put in place in the previous year's documentation which meant that the representation of reports of the membership was reflective of the balance of matches across the three distinct areas of Senior Rugby, School Rugby and Junior Rugby. Excluding High Performance reports the representation achieved for reports was School matches (14% of all reports), Senior matches (39%) and Junior matches (47%) . This was backed up by a very efficient mentoring team of Senior Referees whom worked with individual referees to assist them in developing along the lines of the way in which the current elite referees have developed to achieve their level of competency.

A further change that occurred which did impact came in the form of revised accreditation requirements. To gain Level 1 Referee standing new recruits were required to complete the Foundation Course which had become mandatory. For Level 1 and Level 2 re-accreditation every recommendation had to be formalised by a Competency Report. The outcome of these changes is about quality assurance and improving standards. This latter requirement means that to maintain accreditation match officials must be active over a four year period and submit for a field evaluation in the year that their accreditation expires.

Fortunately the Association had a system in place to track the progress of individual members through to accreditation and re-accreditation and in 2012 in total there were seventy seven (77) accreditation and re-accreditations for which reports were completed resulting in only a small number of carry overs to 2013. The process is made difficult through the practical elements of the process being completed at the pace of the individual and with the QRRA servicing three separate levels of Rugby accreditation and re-accreditation becomes quite time consuming. However the QRRA encouraged members this year to become Referee Coaches and in 2013 with them on board as qualified we would be seeking to expanding their role to encourage and assist those whom are in the accreditation mix to complete those requirements as a matter of priority.

In 2012 the QRRA absorbed fifty two new referees into the system and these newer recruits will require significant attention in 2013. It has been already foreshadowed that in excess of seventy referees will need to be reaccredited as well. Further at this stage the QRRA will need to induct an unspecified number of new recruits.

What this will mean to the QRRA is that whilst the overall referee coaching strategy still remains current, it will be necessary to re-appraise how best to use the existing and newer Referee Coaches and the level of in-house education that will be required to integrate the coaching and accreditation roles of those available Referee Coaches. A start was made on this in 2012 with meetings of the Referee Coaches where issues of "best practice" were introduced. It was recognised through those meetings that QRRA Referee Coaches and particularly those involved in Community Rugby need to focus their attention on basic issues. Initially this means all new referees should early on become competent in positioning, scrum and line out management, and then achieving for players space and time with the key to that being quick ball.

At an Advanced Referee Seminar where Lyndon Bray spoke he emphasised this in the context of Rugby Super 15 Referees leading into International recognition and whilst at Community Rugby level the stakes are not as high the overview of refereeing generally that has to be implemented is one of encouraging more game time, improving referee ability to manage, ensuring a safe environment. It will take quite a commitment by Referees and Referee coaches to achieve developing referee skills sets which take into account the individual skill sets of the individual.

To this end it is planned in 2013 to seek to further encourage our Referee Coaches to within the framework of where they are coaching to be more consistent in the way they look at a game and as a consequence in the advice they provide. A further initiative will be to set up a protocol for feedback on referee progress so that anyone exhibiting potential can be readily identified.

With this information resource collated in a form to pass on to our Appointments Officers we should have an outcome where the most appropriate referee is appointed to matches within a system which provides accurate intelligence.

Once again the Sunnybank club has been supportive of the QRRA in recruiting and developing referees and the model that has been adopted there is quite successful and has solved for that club the issue of finding referees for Under 6 to Under 9 Rugby leading into QRRA membership.

In summary:

- QRRA has recruited and accredited 9 new Referee Coaches and has 15 more partly qualified.
- QRRA has been active with accreditation and re-accreditation with 77 Competency Reports in 2012.
- QRRA has focussed its Referee Coach education on practical coaching particularly at Community Rugby level.
- QRRA has recognised that re-accreditation will use up considerable resources and will aim to complete all 2012 expired by 30th May.
- QRRA will encourage more input from Referee Coaches and provide regular forums so that information can be shared.
- QRRA will encourage closer linkages between Referee Coaching Co-ordinators and Appointments Officers.

Interchange Report 2012

The QRRA Referee Interchange Program offers valuable opportunities for members to experience refereeing, referee coaching and the rugby culture in other areas within Queensland and in New Zealand. Over the years, we have earned an enviable reputation for returning the hospitality provided to QRRA referees by their hosts, to visiting referees from intrastate and overseas. This year we have supported visits from our traditional friends across the ditch, and referees from regional Queensland as well.

In 2012, we hosted visiting referees and referee coaches from Christchurch, Wellington, Hawkes Bay and Northland, and QRRA referees and referee coaches in turn visited them. From regional Queensland, we hosted referees from Toowoomba and Rockhampton. Again this year, we accommodated the visiting referees and their coaches in centrally located hotels which provided easy access to the city, the river and transport, and helped with the logistics of getting visiting referees to and from games. We have received very positive feedback from the visitors as to the standard of the games they were appointed to and the professional approach from our referee coaches, Assistant Referees and members who helped with logistics.

Our members were appointed to good standard games with coaching reports being provided. The extracurricular activities were excellent. Visiting referees were all entertained well. In

particular, visitors to Hawkes Bay maintained our reputation for enjoying roast venison and fine red wine.

Our incoming referees again enjoyed a smorgasbord of quality rugby including Brisbane Seniors, Colts and Juniors, Suburban as well as the Gold Coast International Schools carnival. They received coaching reports as well.

We could not have delivered this Interchange Program without the fantastic help from so many members, who took on such tasks as drivers, BBQ organisers and hosts, tour guides, drinking partners, XXXX brewery tour arrangers and much more. In particular, a big thanks have to go to Tom Ryan, Neil McCann, Mark Hogan, Paul Evans, Duncan Male, Mark Fairweather, Paul Towler, Nicole Sadgrove, Jason Doig, Shane Sullivan, Scott Chapman, for their outstanding assistance. In conclusion, a big thanks also to our Executive Officer Paul Heath for his helping to co-ordinate the day-to-day logistics of our Interchange Program.
